## Briefing note for HSO, ULA, Hume, La Trobe

# LAUNCH OF SAFE COMMUNITY WEEK

February 18 - 25 1996

### Background

The City of Hume and the Shire of La Trobe are hosting SafeComm 5 - the Fifth International Conference on Safe Communities - from February 22 to 25, during which both communities will be inducted into the World Health Organisation's fourteen member International Network of Safe Communities. In order to involve their communities in these significant events, both municipalities have arranged a week of community based safety activities, and have invited local organisations to initiate additional safety activities of their own.

In order to maximise the impact on the whole Victorian Community of SafeComm 5 and of the Third International Conference on Injury Prevention and Control, which immediately precedes SafeComm 5, running from February 19 to 22, the Health and Safety Organisation are mounting a state wide promotion of Safe Community Week. The promotion will comprise a media launch and a mail campaign through relevant networks. Hume City Council have negotiated a two page advertorial feature in the Herald-Sun on Sunday 18 February, with a possible extension to 4 pages if sufficient advertising space is sold.

The state wide launch is proposed to be held at the Urban Land Authority's Roxburgh Park Display Village at 11.00 am on Thursday 15 February. The HSO will formally launch the week, either by the Minister for Business Services, the Hon. Roger Pescott, MLA, or the Chief Executive Officer, Ms Kaye Owen.

**Action required:** *Representatives of the four key organisations - HSO, ULA, Hume and La Trobe need to meet as soon as possible to agree to roles and program, and allocate tasks.*

### Central players in the launch - main media focus

- **HSO:** Opportunity to promote the message that the HSO is now building links with the community and with key players to improve community safety including workplace safety. HSO recognises the ULA as a leader in community safety, through the design of its Roxburgh Park Housing Estate and through its support of the Kidsafe display home and playground at Roxburgh Park. Acknowledge Hume and La Trobe as leaders; suggest **not** to highlight WHO accreditation yet, save that story for the following week. The HSO encourages all Victorians to celebrate Safe Community Week by taking some simple action to improve safety in their local community. HSO officially launches Safe Community Week.
