


2nd Annual Conference 2004

2nd Annual Victorian Conference on Community Safety


- Held Wednesday 17 November 2004.

Conclusions - 1

- The conference was again very well received by participants, with 100% rating it as good (or better), including 87% who rated it very good or excellent.

- The basic format was rated as good, very good or excellent by 100% of respondents.
- Some participants would have liked better opportunities for interaction and discussion.
- The wide range of topics and people was valued.

Suggestions for improvement

- Put the organisation next to the presenter's name on the sessions.
