- Focusing on prevention of unintentional injury in children through working with local governments and communities.





Peer Educator Model

City of Greater Dandenong Maternal & Child Health Service Model

- 'Early Steps' formed as a business unit in 1999.
 (incorporating the MCH Service) This unit supported a multidisciplinary approach.
- Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Parent Friendship and Education groups evolved in conjunction with first time parent groups.
- Multicultural peer group leaders facilitate the CALD parent groups with the support of the Early Steps Community Development Officer and in partnership with community agencies.

Why Arabic, Chinese, Cambodian and Vietnamese Peer Educators?

Fits in with the Early Steps service model - sustainable.

More recent arrivals than any other municipality in Australia with 54% of residents born overseas. (1 in every 7 residents has limited fluency in English)

Of the 9,970 children aged 0-5 years living in the City of Greater Dandenong the top 4 CALD families are:

- 3314 English
- 1194 Vietnamese
- 394 Cantonese
- 344 Khmer
- 227 Arabic



Ballarat SafeStart Office of Housing Project

Focus of the project - Delacombe Housing Estate



- •138 properties
- •73 properties with children under 8 years

125 children aged 0-8yrs

Aims of the Delacombe Project

- Enhanced safety of public housing homes (Delacombe)
- Increased awareness of home safety by public housing tenants
- Reduction to childhood injuries in the home
- Reduce the impact of unintentional injuries on the Health System
- Education/Training for public housing staff regarding home and property safety

Strategies involve structural & behavioural approaches

- Auditing of all properties in the estate
- Installation of safety products to enhance the safety of selected properties
- Access to child safety education & first aid training for residents
- Special promotions to enhance the safety of the physical environment eg BBQ & backyard blitz to remove unwanted rubbish etc

Activities to date



- Initial planning meetings with SafeStart PW & Office of Housing staff
- Development of 2 safety checklists (structural & behavioural)
- Discussions/presentation to local service club regarding their involvement in the project
- Recruitment of appropriate person to conduct property audits by office of Housing
